

# Local Nuisance –Exemptions

If an activity you are proposing in the City of Adelaide may generate a Local Nuisance (e.g. smoke/noise/dust/odour) under the *Local Nuisance and Litter Control Act 2016* and Council considers that 'exceptional circumstances' exist then an exemption may be issued.

## What is required?

An application form must be completed.

A Site Nuisance Plan must also be completed and must contain the following:

- What is going to be the Local Nuisance
- The number of residents and commercial premises occupied by persons likely to be affected by the Local Nuisance
- A map to scale showing location of the activity where the Local Nuisance will resinate from
- The location of the potentially affected persons and premises and the distance from the Local Nuisance
  - Proposed 'communication strategy' for communicating with potentially affected persons
  - Proposed strategy for minimising, managing and monitoring the Local Nuisance on potential persons and premises.

***NB: A Communication Strategy must contain the following: and to be given to those persons potentially affected to notify them of the nature of the proposed activity:***

- *Start/finish dates and times*
- *Anticipated sources of Local Nuisance generated by the activity*
- *Proposed measures to be implemented to minimise the local nuisance*
- *Name and contact details of responsible persons that can be contacted 24/7*

## How and when to apply for an exemption?

An application and Site Nuisance plan for an exemption must be in writing to City of Adelaide:

- 2 weeks prior to the activity commencing; where the activity is for a period not exceeding 24 hours;
- Or 4 weeks prior to the activity commencing; where the activity is for a period longer than 24 hours.
