Bike Riding

To plan your bike journey, visit the Cycle Instead Journey Planner at maps.sa.gov.au/cycleinstead, to choose the best route for your ride. The Journey Planner takes into consideration your fitness and confidence levels, speed of travel and road conditions.

Using Public Transport

If you are planning a short trip across the City, consider public transport as an option. It's quick, easy and cheap – and you won't have any worries about parking.

The free City Connector bus links you to key destinations and attractions around the City and North Adelaide. Tram services between South Terrace and the Entertainment Centre are also free.

Metrocard

Metrocards are the most convenient and cost-effective way to travel by public transport. Cards can be recharged as needed at any Metrocard agent – you can find your nearest one at adelaidemetro.com.au/Tickets/Where-to-buy.

Metrocards can be purchased for \$5 at the Adelaide Metro InfoCentre on the corner of Currie and Grenfell streets, at the Adelaide Railway Station or at any authorised Metrocard agent.
